

## **S. JOHN CHATER' UNIQUE POMEGRANATES**

- EVERSWEET** A unique patented (patent in March of 1985) pomegranate of sweet and soft seeds Produces two crops a year in mid summer and late fall. Weighs from 15 to 20 grams. Good for juice or eating out of hand. Very popular with the public.
- ROSAMIA** A similar variety to the Eversweet in taste. The fruit is larger and it bears a lot of fruit. Produces only one crop in September. Named after my wife.
- AMBROSIA** 'Queen of the Garden'; giant in size, semi tart or semi sweet. Superior look taking all the attention in the garden. Large kernels and thick pulp. Can weigh up to 30 ounces.
- LOULOU** A sweet medium size fruiting plant (like the tangerine in the citrus family) Produces in September.
- BLAZE** A tart red skinned plant with a shiny red rind. When mature the red kernels turn into deep black pulp. Strong, tart taste; medium size.
- GREEN GLOBE** Rind is green and turns golden when mature. Flavor is sweet tart. Fruit hangs down like a chandelier. Ripens from September to November. Fruit is large can weigh up to 30 ounces
- GOLDEN GLOBE** Same as green globe except for the color of the skin This one is yellowish-golden when maturing. Large pink kernels that taste like honey. Produces summer through fall. Weighs about 19 ounces.
- PHOENICIA** A new variety of pomegranates; semi tart superior taste. Large uniform fruits, with red and greenish rind. Ripens in October. Best in jelly and syrups.
- CHATER** A newborn semi-tart golden rind vigorous plant. Excellent in looks and taste. Dark almost black kernels. Weighs up to 18 ounces.
- PRIDEFUL** A new discovery, sweet in taste. Distinct in size, taste, pulp and color Ripens in November and December. Weighs up to 46 ounces.
- LOFFANI** Tart, large black seeds; vigorous and ideal for jellies or juice.
